4. Project/Program Description

The program will expand access to care for individuals with disabilities and their families through a broad spectrum of tailored services and activities. Social, recreational and life skills experiences for children and youth with disabilities ages five through twenty-one are delivered year round through after-school activities & enrichment camps, while these and additional weekend and in-home activities will offer respite to parents and caregivers. To help families navigate raising a child with a disability, and as a prophylactic measure to prevent challenges from turning into life-threatening ones, intensive case management will actively provide counseling, facilitated support groups, and access to essential services as well as a 24/7 crisis line.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The project will equip individuals with disabilities and their families with the tools, skills, and knowledge to navigate and overcome adversity to live full, productive lives. In addition, funds will support and enhance a lifeline connection that is reactive to community-at-large crises and provides a variety of community resources and interventions.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The following activities and services will be provided on-site, in the client's home, and/or in the community: intensive case management and care coordination; facilitated peer support groups; social,cultural, recreational and cultural activities after-school and when schools are closed; volunteer recruitment and engagement; Sunday and weekday parent/caregiver respite; community outreach and engagement; counseling; 24/7 crisis line.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Families will receive counseling for mental health challenges as well as expert navigation/care coordination through case management services. Individuals with disabilities will be paired one to one with teenage mentors where they are immersed in a rich array of activities to broaden there horizons and develop daily living, social, and other transferable skills. Community service events/outreach will also be performed to raise awareness, educate, and improve civic involvement.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



The target population will include elderly persons, persons with poor mental health, persons with poor physical health, the developmentally disabled, physically disabled, high school students, and Jewish community members.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

1. Improved mental health for individuals with special needs and their parents/givers, as measured by improved selfesteem, coping skills; reduced isolation and feelings of helplessness; increased self-advocacy skills; improved subjective appraisal. Attainment of outcome measured through periodic surveys, data analysis, and staff observation

2. Enriched cultural experience, as measured by Improved inter-connectivity, comfort of exercising beliefs, increased participation in cultural and communal activities, safe access to services and programs for congregants. Attainment of outcome measured through periodic surveys, data analysis, and staff observation.
