The remaining funding has been utilized to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 on the institution including paying off student past due balances, updating technology and services for effective remote learning, and providing safe on campus environments during the pandemic. Following the funding guidelines, the majority of this project was not permitted for this funding.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This project funding request will support improved safety and access for Pinellas County and Tampa Bay law enforcement agencies. Completion will support a 15% increase in training capability and significantly enhance safety through improved targeting, electrical, and physical safeguards for trainees.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

These funds will support required pistol and rifle training for local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Citizens will be better protected through competent and state of the art training resources provided through the upgrades of the tracking, electrical, and backstop support systems.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is approximately 7,000 local, state, and federal law enforcement officers who carry firearms as part of thier daily duty requirements. Approximately 1,000 individiduals will be directly served through this project.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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Upon completion of the upgrades the work will be inspected and local, state, and federal agencies will schedule officers and agents for training. This schedule is expected to increase by 15% from FY 2020-2021.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

All contracts have performance standards, no additional penalties are required.
