4. Project/Program Description

We have a growing concern that schools, as currently structured, are not meeting the educational needs of our youth. A large number of children are simply slipping between the cracks at school, failing to consolidate basic skills, developing negative self-perceptions of their competence as students, and eventually withdrawing from academic challenges. The Wayne Barton Study Center believes that low-income children deserve the same opportunity as their more advantaged peers to explore expressive arts, sports, and other developmentally enriching activities. School reform efforts and the push toward National and State standards have brought these trends directly into the public view. In fact, recent studies reveal that many policy makers are now looking to after-school Academic Enrichment programs to correct educational failures. This project will provide Afterschool Academic Enrichment Services to approximately 2049 students (6) Days per week (5) hours per day.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Prior to the Covid-19 Pandemic a large number of students were simply slipping between the cracks at school, failing to consolidate basic skills, developing negative self-perceptions of their competence as students, and eventually withdrawing from academic challenges. In light of the Covid-19 Pandemic and schools functioning through Distance/Virtual Learning the number of students falling behind has drastically increased.

The goal of the proposed project is to provide children with the opportunity to improve academically, in order to meet or exceed State Standards in core academic subjects, develop positive interactions with others, develop lifelong pro-social skills, avoid destructive behaviors in a safe and nurturing environment and help at-risk children successfully obtain a high school diploma as well as further their education.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The methods used to achieve these goals are to (1) provide a friendly, yet academic environment for children and teens to complete homework, study for tests, and improve general academic skills, (2) provide professionally trained teachers for a range of academic subjects, (3) provide an ongoing assessment of needs, based on student performance, (4) and provide structured activities that stress education and personal growth.

Certified Teachers, at a ratio of 15:1, will provide academic instruction, homework assistance, tutoring and enrichment activities; (6) Days per week, (5) Hours per day to approximately 2049 students. Services provided include: Transport

Academic Tutoring, Homework Assistance, Health and Nutrition, Recreational Activities, Daily Hot Meals, Transportation To the Facility, Counseling and Supportive Services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population of students we will be providing services to are classified as severely impoverished, Academically Low- Functioning (many of whom have learning deficits due to drug exposure while in-vitro). 90% of the students we provide services to will be 1st Generation College Students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The benefit to the State of Florida will be the long-term outcome for future generations.

The centers for Disease Control (2018) stated that "Good education predicts good health and disparities in education and educational achievement are closely linked. Despite these connections, public health professionals rarely make reducing the number of students who drop out of school a priority, although nearly one-third of all students in the United States and one-half of Black, Latino, and Native American students do not graduate from high school on time. Furthermore, the CDC contends that "Education is one of the strongest predictors of health. The more schooling people have the better their health is likely to be. Although education is highly correlated with income and occupation, evidence suggests that education exerts the strongest influence on health.

If performance measures are not met, consideration for additional funding opportunities will be denied and funds received in advance returned.
