12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

These corridors have been identified by the City of Tampa and FDOT as a critical corridor in need of safety improvements, specifically for pedestrians. The corridors are within the East Tampa Redevelopment Area and have been identified in the CRA's Strategic Action Plan. 14th St is on the city's High Injury Network as a Vision Zero Corridor. The need for funds has been documented in the East Tampa CRA Strategic Action Plan and in the City of Tampa Vision Zero Action Plan.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project includes enhanced crossings, signalized intersection, and new sidewalks and multimodal facilities, including transit improvements.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

It will provide safety and multi-modal benefits by improving walkability, pedestrian access, and ADA compliance.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

General population including residents, workers, and customers.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Reduce congestion by providing safe multi-modal alternatives to roadways and parking facilities that are at or near capacity (measured by traffic studies), and reduce traffic related injuries and/or fatalities. Crash analysis and pedestrian counts will be used to measure project's success.
