a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This project will improve safety for families who walk and bike to the Sulphur Springs K-8 school. The school is located in one of the city's Opportunity Zones and enrolls 97% economically disadvantaged students. The Sulphur Springs neighborhood has one of the highest concentrations of households with no vehicles, which makes improvements for safe walking and biking conditions more imperative. Several neighborhood and Hillsborough TPO subcommittee meetings have been completed. The project was initiated at request of the Hillsborough County School Board.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Sidewalks, curb ramps, crosswalks, and bulb-outs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Improved pedestrian safety.

General population including students. 1,500 daily.

Improved pedestrian safety. Traffic studies and decreased injuries.
