12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds will go to support first year efforts of a nine-month pre-apprenticeship program sponsored by Associated Builders and Contractors through the Florida Trade Academy. Specifically, these funds will allow FTA to launch a much-needed path for graduating high school seniors and others seeking an avenue to apprenticeship in electrical, HVAC, plumbing and/or fire sprinkler alarm installation.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Florida Trade Academy will provide a nine-month pre-apprenticeship program which will include OSHA and safety courses, professional skills classes and selected 101 coursework which will then certify students to begin a full-scale apprenticeship program leading to employment.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The services provided to citizens will be to encourage more individuals to pursue lifelong careers in the trades. Not everyone is college bound, and as a society we need to be ok with that. Labor shortage in the construction industry is at an all time high. This program will help expedite those entering the realm of apprenticeship by helping them complete their pre-apprenticeship courses so they can smoothly transition into apprenticeship and employment. Currently, when a student wants to enroll in apprenticeship training, there are prerequisites he/she must meet, and most of the time are incomplete causing delays. This program will be sponsored by the Associated Builders and Contractors Gulf Cast Chapter as their pre-apprenticeship school.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is graduating high school seniors and/or others wishing to enroll in a 10-month pre-apprenticeship program. This project will focus on enrolling 25 students who will complete the program and enroll in an apprenticeship program thereafter.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will



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be measured?

The goal is to have 25 students in our inaugural class and all are hired and enrolled in apprenticeship programs within the state of Florida. They will be measured as actual apprentices through the state hired by contractors and in a state sponsored apprenticeship program, such as the Associated Builders and Contractors.
