Classroom instruction and specialized training in the Health Care and Solar Energy fields. Industry Certification upon successful completion of the program and exam.

Our target populations are jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, At-risk youth, High school students, University/College students, and formerly incarcerated persons.

We expect to serve between 100-200 students.

The expected benefit of this project is improved quality of education. The project will support the offering of two new training programs that will increase the chances for job seekers to improve their entry level employability skills that will help shape their career paths.
