Stormwater improvements will improve water quality discharging to St. Joseph Sound an Outstanding Florida Water which has significant seagrass meadows and wildlife that are dependent on good water quality.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Reduce waste water infiltration and intrusion, improved water quality, reduce flooding

Utilizing both traditional and green infrastructure will allow the County to treat stormwater flows prior to discharge into St. Joseph Sound and Outstanding Florida Water.

Pinellas County has a robust water quality monitoring program in St. Joseph Sound and reports out water quality data to an on-line dashboard that is available to the public. The County also monitors seagrass and habitat and shares this information with all interested stakeholders. Water quality through the on line dashboard and tracking of system performance through the County's routine stormwater inspection and maintenance program. All data is tracked through a work management system for easy reporting and is fully funded by a stormwater utility.
