Minimum water on the roads due to the water percolating into the ground by a French Drainage System and being treated prior to entering the Floridian Aquifer for drinking water. Enhance/preserve/improvement environmental or fish and wildlife quality: The environmental treatment of the water as it enters the French Drainage System and swales where the water percolates into the ground. This water could filtrate into the main canals (C-8 and C-9) which will benefit the fish and wildlife.
