12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Increased competitiveness of FL manufacturing focusing on building the talent pipeline, upskilling incumbent workers, increasing the adoption of smart factory technologies, and building more robust, resilient supply chains. Economic growth through business expansion and retention activities that will advance and diversify the economy. Specific purpose of funds is to bring these services to unserved and under-served regions of the state, with a particular emphasis on rural manufacturing regions.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Improve resiliency with productivity-enhancing business and technical assistance to accelerate technology adoption, develop talent to narrow or close the skills gap, and to increase growth through the development of supply chains, new products, processes, customers, and markets.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Accelerated adoption of advanced manufacturing technologies and processes, leadership and workforce talent training and development, strategic business growth of new and existing customers and markets, including greater participation of Florida firms in the commercial space, aerospace, aviation, defense, medical, and food supply chains.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida's 22,127 manufacturing establishments and the 386,200 people employed by them.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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Core measures include new and retained sales, cost savings and avoidance, increased capital investment, and jobs created or retained. Federal sponsor surveys clients, through a third-party, 6 to 12 months after project completion to determine the impacts realized.
