4. Project/Program D	escription					
This will be to fund a "no eject-no reject" shelter. Community Based Care organizations are required to accept every child that is removed from the family home which includes foster children who have significantly complex issues. The shelter will take harder to place children including those with a criminal, substance abuse, mental illness, sexual abuse or runaway history that prohibits traditional foster homes from accepting them. This will also enable case managers to avoid the need to keep children who have been expelled from school in the office.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The shelter will serve as a safe place for children with significant criminal history, substance abuse history, mental illness, or other reasons they are in foster care and cannot be placed in a traditional foster home. Children will go to school, court hearings, extracurricular activities and will be able to remain in the shelter without having to wait for placement.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The shelter will allow children to have a safe place to reside when the option of a traditional foster home is unavailable due to the child's significant criminal history, substance abuse history or mental illness. There will be education, transportation, extracurricular activities, social skills, food, clothing, personal needs, etc.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The shelter would provide all the basic needs; however, there would be additional case management wraparound services, education, transportation, extracurricular activities, medical, dental, and social activities such as movies, parks, etc.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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This program will serve children identified as "at risk" due to their substance abuse, criminal activity, mental health and other high risk behaviors resulting in their inability to be placed in a traditional licensed foster home setting. These children often have significant and unresolved trauma as a result of abuse, neglect, and/ or abandonment from their own family and need a safe and nurturing home environment until such time that the youth are able to be safely reunified with their family, placed with a relative or non-relative caregiver, or matched with one of our licensed foster homes to promote their long-term safety, wellness, and stability. The shelter will be licensed for 6 children at a time.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The children will have a safe place to live when there is no other option for the child. This will lower the run episodes of the child, lower their episodes of criminal activity as they will have their needs met, increase stability in their educational needs and stabilize behaviors while children are waiting on a higher level of care.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The Community Based Care Organization would return unused money to the Department of Children and Families.
