IRSC has received \$65.7 million in CARES/HEERF funding as part of federal COVID stimulus. •\$26.61 million was pass through to students to assist them in maintaining educational progress during the pandemic.

•\$3.45 million was provided to Minority Serving Institutions, and these funds were to directly and positively impact minority students and programs.

•\$35.64 million was allocated to IRSC for institutional aid. Expenditures: 1) PPE purchases and implementation - \$263,357; 2)Technology upgrades to shift learning opportunities online - \$6,612,562; 3) Institutional Aid - \$8,385,482.

#### 12. Program Performance

## a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The specific purpose of the requested funds is to make site improvements to undeveloped land located in Indiantown, FL allowing for the construction of a charter workforce high school to be built by Indian River State College with private funds. The site improvements are necessary to bring water and wastewater to the site as selected by IRSC, Martin County, and the donor involved.

## b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The selected site in Indiantown will be construction ready and Indian River State College will be able to proceed with the construction of a full-service, workforce charter high school to serve the residents of this underserved municipality.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

In an area with none of these available - project will directly provide secondary 9-12 curriculum; workforce training opportunities in manufacturing, industrial skills trades, and more; traditional and career dual enrollment opportunities; college courses and CTE for the community during nights and weekends.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Main target population for the project is grade school and high school students in Indiantown, FL (>800 annually) who are underserved with no high school to attend locally. The Charter H.S. will also be a central training point after school hours for additional IRSC courses/programs and serve jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, and citizens seeking college curriculum and/or workforce training.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

A few of the expected outcomes of the project include, but are not limited to:

Improvement of Indiantown student graduation rates which are behind Martin Co., State of FI, and National metrics; Improvement of Indiantown college/training attainment rates;

Improvement of Indiantown student absenteeism in grades 9-12.

Data will be captured annually by IRSC and Martin Co. School District to demonstrate intended project outcomes.

The project will also increase and improve ecomonic activity in the long term, enhancing the employment pipeline.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The funding will be returned to the State of Florida if the project does not initiate.

The site improvements will take place on raw land owned by Martin County and leased in perpetuity to Indian River State College for the purposes of erecting a workforce charter high school in Indiantown, FL.
