4. Project/Program Description

Our Family Program Support Network serves low-income families who are working or in school with high quality childcare, healthcare services and family strengthening services that aim to keep people healthy, employed and able to enhance their career development. Our programming has proven to be an essential resource, especially during the COVID-19 public health & economic crisis. We are the only NAEYC (National Association for the Education of Young Children)-accredited center in Fort Lauderdale serving the entire family through a two-generation model that allows parent to maintain/advance employment and work toward self-sufficiency, through the provision of case management, parent education, and emergency assistance, while their children receive high quality early childhood education. This funding will ensure our ability to provide economic empowerment to parents so they may maintain employment and advance economically.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Family Program Support Network and the HEALTH Program will provide low-income families who are working or in school with high quality childcare, healthcare services and family strengthening services that will keep them healthy, employed and able to enhance their career development. Through the provision of case management, healthcare services, parent education, and emergency assistance, our programming allows parents to maintain/advance employment and work toward self-sufficiency.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Jack & Jill Center parents, a large percentage of whom are essential workers and have served the community throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, will be able to maintain/advance their employment due to the services provided by our Family and Health Programs. Our programs directly impact our parents' ability to attend work or school, earn a living, stay healthy and better their economic circumstances.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Family Program strengthens families primarily by providing intensive parent education and case management. Through this program, families increase financial stability, maintain employment and achieve job achievement. Through our HEALTH Program, we reduce barriers to access. Our goal is to ensure the life-long academic achievement, productivity, and success of our children and their families.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



90% of the parents we serve live within 175% of the Federal poverty line, are headed by working single mothers who make an average \$27,400/annually, and are supporting more than one child. The target population includes jobless persons; economically disadvantaged persons; homelessness; preschool students and grade school students. We expect to serve 201-400 persons.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Children and families enrolled at Jack & Jill Center have unrestricted access to our HEALTH Program. Through comprehensive health assessments, provision of health services, preventative healthcare, and community partnerships, this program has a significant positive impact on the physical health and wellness of our community. We enable children to grow physically, emotionally, and socially in a safe, caring environment using age-appropriate methods for cognitive growth. Children are screened 2-3 times a year using Florida VPK Assessment & Teaching Strategies Gold. Scores are maintained in their individual portfolio and compared to nationally set standards. Through early intervention, family support, parent education, and case management/counseling, we aim to increase and improve economic activity in our community. Jack & Jill administers a Family Assessment upon a family's enrollment and annually thereafter. New assessments are compared to previous ones to track success/effectiveness.
