#### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Protect local government operations, data, and financial information. Cities and counties provide uninterruptable services and collect gigabytes of personally identifiable, confidential, making them vulnerable to cyberattack proprietary information about citizens and businesses.

#### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Florida Center for Cybersecurity will work with the Florida Digital Service (FDS) and other non-government stakeholders (e.g., UWF, FIU) to improve local government cybersecurity through grants and technical assistance. Four million (\$4.0M) will be 'passed through' Cyber Florida, with \$500K for staff to compete, award, administer, evaluate, and report to the legislature on grant program, and \$500K for staff/consultants to conduct, publish two comprehensive studies, and coordinate statewide cybersecurity training.

#### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Reduce and prevent cyberattacks against local governments. Ensure continuation of critical government services, and protect personal, confidential and proprietary information of individuals and businesses.

#### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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Local governments needing assistance to improve cyber infrastructure.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Track number of successful/unsuccessful cyber attacks. Evaluate improvements and enhancements to existing IT defense strategies. Track number of individuals trained, number of assessments completed, number of agencies that meet NiST framework. All data will be reported to EOG, Cyber Advisory Council, and Florida Legislature by January of 2023.
