a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Goal is to provide for adequate water delivery, increased water pressure for fire protection & improved water quality/quantity and eliminate water leaks/shut downs/boil water episodes, property damage, loss of revenues by replacing .75 miles of old, failing 12" water mainlines from the water treatment plant to the 4th Ave. water tower, the watermain between Wildcat Way Tower and the water treatment plant and the loop between the 2 elevated towers, as designed. Addresses & meets the permitting agencies & Health Dept. regulations and SRF Drinking Water Facilities Plan. Protects & improves life, health & safety for the citizenry, residents, businesses visitors, general public & surrounding areas

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The activities & services to be provided include the selection of contractual engineering, project management and construction services through the City's procurement process to replace .75 miles of 12" water mainlines from the water treatment plant to the 4th Ave. water tower, water tower, the watermain between Wildcat Way Tower and the water treatment plant and the loop between the 2 elevated towers as designed.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Improved life, health & safety with adequate water delivery, increased water pressure for fire protection & improved water quality/quantity. Elimination of water leaks/shut downs/boil water episodes that has occurred with the current old, failing infrastructure.

Target population in this financially disadvantaged community located in a Rural Area of Opportunity that will be served includes citizenry, residents, visitors, general public, the business community -- banks, hospitals, restaurants, and the surrounding areas. Population expected to be served exceeds 25,000.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Benefit is improved life, health & safety; improved water quality/quantity, increased water pressure for fire protection & provides for adequate water delivery; meeting the permitting agencies requirements, the Health Dept. regulations, and the SRF Drinking Water Facilities Plan. Funding from the utility will be used for on-going maintenance. Employment maintained from project. Improved economy, less loss of State revenues with the reduction of water shut down events/boil water episodes property damage and business closures.

Non payment of invoices until milestones are achieved; implementation of a corrective action plan.
