The new tanker truck will allow the Department to respond to emergency calls, both in Calhoun County and neighboring counties when needed, with a reliable truck able to reach the intended location.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Carr/Clarksville Volunteer Fire Department is in need of a tanker truck to replace the current truck in their fleet. The current truck has a 1965 trailer with cast iron pipes and requires frequent repairs. The new tanker truck will allow the very-active Carr/Clarksville Fire Department to respond to emergency calls, both in Calhoun County and neighboring counties when needed, with a reliable truck able to reach the intended location.

These funds will allow for the purchase of a new tanker truck, which will replace the current truck that requires frequent repairs. This will allow the Department to have a reliable truck to respond to emergency calls in Calhoun County and neighboring counties when needed.

The new truck will help the VFD to respond and act efficiently and effectively to any emergency and/or non-emergency situations in the community, for all citizens within the department's range of assistance.

The target population served by this project is all of Calhoun County. The Carr/Clarksville VFD is the most centrally located fire department in Calhoun County, so they can respond to calls all over the county and possibly surrounding counties. The population of Calhoun County is approximately 15,000.

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The new truck will help the VFD to respond and act efficiently and effectively to any emergency and/or non-emergency situations in the community, for all citizens within the department's range of assistance. The outcome can be measured by the amount of calls they receive and the response effectiveness.
