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c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services to 500 families with a focus on transformational training, housing, and youth development needs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Elderly persons, homeless persons, developmentally disabled persons, physically disabled persons, drug users (in health services), preschool students, persons with poor mental health, grade school students, high school students, university/college students, persons with poor physical health, currently or formerly incarcerated persons, drug offenders (in criminal justice), victims of crime, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, and citizens who have lived in generational public housing and generational crime and poverty.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve physical health, improve mental health, enrich cultural experience, improve quality of education, protect the general public from harm (environmental, criminal, etc.), increase or improve economic activity, enhance specific individuals with economic self sufficiency, reduce recidivism, reduce substance abuse, and divert individuals from the criminal/juvenile justice system.
