a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Antidote's Rapid Response application provides police officers with a simple, powerful tool to access clinicians via telemedicine to help successfully treat patients who present mental and behavioral health issues. Our objective is to deescalate the situation or to divert the subject to more appropriate treatment options. These treatment options include an escalated in network referral to a more specialized clinician on Antidote's platform or a referral to other resources in the community.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

A pilot with up to three Sheriff's offices would receive equipment, training & access to the platform. Once trained, officers would be able to use the intervention tool that can help provide appropriate treatment paths for individuals in need. This will lead to safer communities, less tax payer drainage due to fewer incarcerations, & more productive & contributing citizens.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

By treating mental health issues from the first moment patients are identified, we will enable more effective treatment paths for individuals. If the subject accepts, he/she will be immediately connected to a licensed clinician for immediate treatment. A clinician will then decide the next best course of action including best next steps, clinical advice, deescalation, an in network escalation, etc

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?



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Greater than 800 people. Elderly; Persons with poor mental health; Economically disadvantaged individuals; at-risk youth; homeless; developmentally disabled; drug users; currently or formerly incarcerated persons; drug offenders (in criminal justice system)
