4. Project/Program Description

Design and build a hardened facility to house the city's Emergency Operations Center (EOC), our back-up Police/Fire Emergency Dispatch Center, and Information Technology (I.T.) Department. Currently, the City of Temple Terrace converts its all-purpose classroom into its EOC when the need dictates such. This classroom (building) is over 40 years old and is not rated to withstand any winds over a category 2 hurricane. Neither the current back-up Emergency Dispatch Center, nor the city's I.T Department is located in a facility capable of withstanding a category 2 or above hurricane. In order to operate efficiently and safely during emergency operations (i.e. hurricanes, tornadoes, and/or flooding), the city is in dire need of a new hardened building capable of withstanding such weather.

12. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The City of Temple Terrace currently works out of a converted classroom for its EOC. The current building is not rated for anything above a category 2 hurricane. Space is extremely limited and outdated. By receiving these funds, the city would be able to build a much needed EOC that is rated to withstand a category 5 hurricane. The city would also relocate its back-up emergency Police/Fire Dispatch and city Information Technology (I.T.) department within this hardened facility.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The city would be able to provide seamless emergency operations during significant storms, tornadoes, hurricanes, public disturbances, etc. Also, the city would be able to dispatch police, fire, and ambulances with uninterrupted service. The I.T. services will be protected and be able to continue functioning during severe storm conditions.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Uninterrupted emergency services (police, fire) during times that dictate the opening and operations of the Emergency Operations Center. Uninterrupted police and fire dispatching, and citywide I.T. services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is the 27,000 residents who live within the city limits. This same population would be served by this new facility.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?



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The city would benefit by establishing a working environment that is safe for its employees while providing a more efficient way of operating within the EOC during operational needs. This can be measured by being able to remain a functioning emergency dispatch service to the citizens.

Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
