The Chain of Lakes Blueway Trail Access Project will connect the Intracoastal Waterway to the Chain of Lakes by installing a two-way boat lift and portage for small boats and non-motorized watercrafts such as kayaks, paddle boards, and canoes. As a result, a new Blueway Trail will be created as part of Palm Beach County's and Florida's vast Greenway and Blueway Trail System, which encourages eco-tourism through environmental restoration and preservation.

Engineering analysis and design for a boat lift at the S-155 structure on the C-51 canal, as well as construction and installation of boat lift structure at C-51 spillway, and upgrades to adjacent piers for public boating benefit.

This project will provide an easier and quicker path for boaters, kayakers, canoers, and paddle boarders to access the Lake Worth Lagoon from the Chain of Lakes. The Blueway Trail will be created as part of Palm Beach County's and Florida's vast Greenway and Blueway Trail System, which encourages eco-tourism through environmental restoration and preservation
