The primary goal is to ensure the health and safety of public safety personnel. These workers, employed in some of the most dangerous occupations, require safe, secure, and healthy environments in which to work and rest. This project makes improvements to Public Safety/Fire Station 97 to ensure the public safety personnel stationed here are protected from environmental and weather-related harm.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

A capital project will be initiated to provide a secure, functional, healthy environment for the police and firefighters housed in Public Safety/Fire Station 97 including hurricane resistant garage doors and safer living quarters.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Reliable, responsive police and fire services will be provided by this project.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The residents of the entire City of Parkland totaling 34,600 as of the 2020 US Census, plus surrounding communities, will benefit from this project.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Response time to calls for assistance will meet or be shorter than expected times for a majority of calls. Broward Sheriff's Office measures deputy response time to calls, with a goal of 7 minutes or less. Coral Springs/Parkland Fire Rescue measures response time to calls with a goal of averaging 8 minutes or less.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The City of Parkland would draw funds on a reimbursement basis so deliverables can be a condition of receiving funds, negating the need for penalties.
