This project is the construction of a new building to replace 5 buildings at the University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (UF/IFAS) Horse Teaching Unit (HTU). The facilities are old and have deteriorated to the point that renovation is not an option. They are not safe for students, faculty, staff, or animals. There are holes in a roof and a wall, unsafe wiring, and fire hazards but no fire safety equipment. These facilities flood regularly resulting in canceled classes, disruption of research and extremely unsafe conditions for students.
