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14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To improve seniors' quality of life, preserve their independence and also to provide support for their caregiver in order to prevent or delay the need for institutional placement. Funding will allow the Center to continue to provide daily hot meals, exercise sessions, socialization activities, transportation, adult day care, and informational lectures. Community based programs help seniors, 60 years of age or older, stay healthy and save tax dollars by delaying or avoiding nursing home admissions.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Center provides daily hot meals, transportation services, recreational classes, exercises classes, socialization elements, counseling services, educational lectures, and adult day care which are essential in avoiding isolation and depression. All participants would benefit from a renovation to the Center so that it is more ADA accessible.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Renovation of the computer lab will allow the Center to expand its technology class program. Hardening the Center to increase ADA accessibility will make it easier for Center members to move around in the Center. Recreational and educational programs at the center are provided to Seniors, 60 years of age or older living mainly in the NW quadrant of Broward County.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All older adults in the NW guadrant of Broward County. The City of Margate has an estimated 14,000 residents that are over the age of 60. The only requirement for Center membership is to be 60 years of age or older.

The Center expects to serve over 800 seniors with the funding provided.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Community based programs help seniors 60 years of age and older stay healthy and save tax dollars by delaying or avoiding nursing home admission.

In recent years, the cost of a nursing home admission was estimated to be \$97,800 vs. Community Care Services at \$8,500 per person.

This project will expand seniors socialization options which is a crucial factor to avoid institutionalization, isolation, and depression.

Expected outcomes include: improved physical and mental health, enrichment of cultural experiences, improved quality of education, and enhancement of individual's economic self sufficiency.
