4. Project/Program Description

To attain self-support/sustainment from extended power interruptions resulting from weather impacts, grid failures and targeted infrastructure attacks. All campus security and safety systems are dependent on power to maintain access-control barriers, early-warning systems and emergency access. PLEASE note that this campus' facilities serve as an 'as needed' area staging site for first-responders during hurricanes or other all-hazard incident needs. Therefore incorporation of back-up generators is the goal.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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To provide uninterrupted services (2-schools, Jewish Community Center, Adult Learning Programming, Specialized Instruction and special community events) to area residents and active support to area first responders as an 'as needed' Staging Center during extended Critical Incidents or during hurricanes when power infrastructures are compromised. Funding assistance for this local project will provide support necessary for the installation of a comprehensive back-up power generation system that will maintain security/safety/environmental systems to maintain operational services to area residents.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

A selected contractor/integrator will design, obtain City/County permitting, install and integrate the campus-wide Rapid Emergency Back-Up Power Generation System. Contractor will additionally provide formal testing of the system and training following installation/integration to insure comprehensive and consistent power is assured during all-hazards.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funding will directly affect the ability to provide services (2-schools, Jewish Community Center, Adult Learning Programming, Specialized Instruction and special community events) to area residents and actively support area first responders as an 'as needed' Staging Center during extended Critical Incidents or during hurricanes when power infrastructures are compromised to ensure continuity of emergency services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is comprehensive. The Maitland Jewish Campus serves (2) Florida Counties - Orange & Seminole. Active persons and families; Elderly persons; Persons with poor mental health; Developmentally disabled; Physically disabled; Preschool students; Grade school students; High school students; University/College students, Young Adults, Professionals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The ability to self-generate power to maintain campus systems/in-place security systems (reliant on power to function) to thwart growing threats to the community and facilities when area-regional power providers are unavailable. Affirms that the school teaching environment is healthy and security systems are functioning to maintain a safe and secure learning space.
The ability to provide powered shelter and staging site to first responders during and post hurricanes and All-Hazard events requiring extended operations support.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Consideration for contractual inclusion of financial penalties of \$500.00 a day past agreed upon milestones-deadlines. This would include all reasonable expectations of operational progress and provision/s for unforeseeable-uncontrollable circumstance.
