4. Project/Program Description

The project aims to mitigate the growing reach of natural disasters, specifically related to flooding, as they continue to impact homeowners, residents, guests, and businesses in the Winter Park region. Located within the heart of Martin Luther King Jr. Park, Lake Mendsen provides a natural respite to compliment this major park enjoyed by families and provides a artistic backdrop to the new Library and Event Center. It also serves as a regional stormwater hub for the immediate area for business and corporate headquarters such as Brasfield & Gorrie and Timbers Resorts along the U.S. 17-92 corridor. During recent years, the number of 100 and 500 year storms have compelled the City to take action to fight against infrastructure, roadway, residential, and commercial flooding. The City has begun evaluating cost effective and feasible engineering alternatives to mitigate the looming distress associated with Lake Mendsen with a recently completed stormwater master plan within its CRA area.

Infrastructure enhancements, resiliency, disaster mitigation, and quality of life improvements.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Investment into capital infrastructure associated with flooding mitigation that is currently impacting residents, homeowners, and businesses.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Improved use of municipal infrastructure during storm events, and prevention of home impacts, insurance claims, and property distress.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Approximately 34,000 households, 6400 businesses, 70,000 employees, and 76,000 residents are located within a three (3) mile ring of the proposed project area. Of which, approximately 20% of residents are above age 65 and potentially considered at risk.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Proposed improvements were modeled with a private consultant using recent data on hydrology, soils, land use, topography, drainage infrastructure, stormwater BMPs, and FEMA floodplains. The improvement model showcased mitigation, specifically within the most frequent 2-year, 24 hour rain event, of 16".
