### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



The specific purpose is to build a high school that will be part of Academy at the Farm Charter School. There is a high demand, need, and request for a charter high school to be built in this area. The goal is to give the community a high school that provides inclusion, character education, and individualized instruction, as well as a successful school that follows the Elementary and Middle School A Plus School ranking for multiple years in a row.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Many students will have the opportunity to continue their education at a successful charter high school. The students will also participate in a character education program through the AATF Six Character Traits. In addition, the students will be provided with individualized instruction as Academy at the Farm is an inclusion school with a 1:8 ratio (each classroom includes a teacher and an Instructional Assistant).

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

To provide a successful charter high school that focuses on inclusion and more individualized instruction. The school would emphasize character education and prioritize the resiliency of students while providing an inclusive education program that builds students' social, teamwork, communication and leadership skills through research based Kagan structures utilized in the classroom. The outcome will be graduates with the necessary life skills needed for their future education and/or careers.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population that will be served by this project will be high school students. The number of individuals expected to be served will be around 450.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

#### be measured?

The high school students will be able to preserve their mental well-being through the mentoring program, Character Education and a Peer Counseling elective. There will also be an increase in the number of students enrolled in the Agriculture program as the inclusion of FFA is integrated into the high school programs rather than as an extra curricular activity. Students will learn how to work cooperatively with peers through specific Kagan strategies taught in the classroom. The school will also be able to provide about 40 jobs to fill the necessary positions to run the high school.

The penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures will be addressed with liquidated damages. This could be incorporated into the overall construction contract.
