14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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A larger training facility will allow us to increase the number of veterans receiving the assistance they need throughout the state. We will be able to expand our reach to others outside of our demographic market, including the underserved. Having and owning our own training facility will allow us to reduce overhead costs from our lease and allow us to serve a higher number of veterans in the State of Florida. A new training facility will allow us to hold all training, mental health counseling and aftercare events under one roof.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Our program includes a complete 24 week service dog training program that includes the acquisition of a dog, service vest, crate and car harness, certification record, patches and all other necessary equipment at no charge to the service member or veteran. Life skills as well as mental health counseling are offered to the service member or veteran as well as the spouse and family. Having a larger facility will also allow us to have aftercare events at our facility to further support and evaluate our veterans continuing plan of care and support.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct Services include Veteran/K9 Training;basic, graduate and advanced levels, lifetime support to all veterans including their K9's and families. Services include access to our professional staff for any training assistance during their training sessions as well as after graduation, quarterly aftercare events for veterans and their families, free mental health counseling by our on site Licensed Clinical Social Worker for both private and group counseling sessions. Life skills to assist veteran with laws pertaining to them and their service dog as well as working out real life scenario training in our scenario rooms located in our training facility to help prepare them for public outings.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Veterans and Active Duty Service Members who have been diagnosed with PTSD, TBI and/or MST from all eras,(Not just Post 9-11). Also included are the spouses/caregivers, children and other family members as well as the Florida communities in which the veteran resides all of whom benefit with the help of a service dog allows them to break through the invisible wounds of war and rejoin society. The Tampa Bay area is home to over 320,000 veterans and the state of Florida has the 3rd largest population of veterans in the country.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit for program veterans that have graduated from our program after receiving training of their own service dog is a statistically significant improvement in the post test scores of all clinical surveys that are conducted and administered by our in house Licensed Clinical Social Worker. The results of our training program are then independently researched and evaluated by PhD, LCSW Professors at the University of Central Florida with over 6 years of empirical data. The result is that our program allows graduates to become productive members of their communities as they transition from a life of isolation to one of socialization.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

In the event K9 Partners for Patriots fails to meet the contractual deliverables, the financial consequences would be to refund any unused monies after the completion of the project.
