a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Wildlife habitats will be the anchor of Busch Wildlife Sanctuary. Our goal in designing the facility is to highlight the ever-changing landscape of Florida, our impact on the animals that we share our environment with, and how our community members can help preserve our precious natural resources.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Our Sanctuary has over 200,000+ visitors annually. As we are free to the public,we target all populations regardless of socio-economic background.

- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
- 1) This unique facility offers a one-of-a-kind opportunity to learn about nature while providing a sanctuary for wildlife and people. We have something for everyone; young and old alike. From story time for parents with toddlers to family nightwalks, education activities appeal to a broad range of people. This will be measured by the number of guests who visit. 2) Children tend to perform better on standardized tests and have fewer attendance problems if they spend time outside. Measured by the number of students from across Florida who take field trips to Busch Wildlife Sanctuary to enhance their science curriculum and take part in our STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math) related educational content. 3) Busch Wildlife Sanctuary serves Florida by helping sick, injured and orphaned wildlife. The public bring them to our hospital or a member of our trained, volunteer rescue team retrieve animals that are too dangerous for the public to intercept.
