14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Path to College has observed that economically disadvantaged students do not have access to opportunities that expose them to STEM careers. With this state funding, Path to College will launch new programming that will primarily focus on targeting 500 low-income students to prepare them for career paths in the growing STEM industries. This will increase and improve the available talent pool in Florida as more advanced industries relocate to our state.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

In addition to year-long career exposure opportunities, the program will include a week-long summer camp to immerse students in the world of science, technology, engineering, robotics, mathematics and more. These expenses will cover the use of facilities and operations to conduct the program in multiple locations, and equipment & materials.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

During week-long summer camp experiences, students will gain proficiency to prepare for STEM careers while still in middle and high school. They will enhance math skills, learn through hand-on projects to complete and showcase their work to their peers and compete for prizes. This fun atmosphere will increase learning and make this career path attractive. They will also meet STEM professionals.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population will be grade school students, high school students & University/College students. The target number of individuals to be served is 500.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Students will demonstrate growth in STEM career path knowledge, basic life skills and problem solving knowledge as evidenced by pre-post assessments. 75% of 500 students will demonstrate an increase in STEM careers knowledge as evidenced by pre-post survey results.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Not meeting contractual deliverables may not warrant future funding. As an example of our track record, Path to College has obtained the highest rating from Guidestar and the Nonprofits First excellence in nonprofit management and has 3-5 year relationships with well-established funding partners.
