4. Project/Program Description

The Infrastructure Sustainability Improvement Program, or iSIP, is a crucial long-term initiative of the City's overall robust and comprehensive asset management program. The City uses technology and data to evaluate, prioritize, and improve critical infrastructure throughout the City's water distribution and wastewater collection systems. The City identified the first six project areas whose costs are estimated to be ~ \$45M with a total program cost of ~\$160M. All projects are currently funded solely by the City. One of the projects currently under design is the Tunison Palms and Floresta Project Area which is generally bounded on the east and west between NW 9th and 7th Avenues, on the north and south from NW 7th Street and Palmetto Park Road. It is a residential area with single family homes and includes ~50,000 linear feet of drinking water mains and 4,500 linear feet of sewer force main. The project also includes sidewalk improvements and ~39,000 of road improvements.

Stormwater, sidewalk, and roadway improvements are also included providing an holistic approach.

Engineering design services for and construction for the replacement and improvements to the City's drinking water transmission and distribution as well as wastewater collection infrastructure systems in the project area including drinking water services, valves, and mains and wastewater collection system force mains.

Ensuring future sustainability of critical and essential drinking water distribution and transmission as well as wastewater collection infrastructure systems which provide for drinking water and sewer collection in the project area and throughout the City's drinking water and wastewater service area. The target population to be served by the project are the residents who reside in the project area as well as residents and visitors to the City of Boca Raton and those residents in portions of unincorporated Palm Beach County served by the City of Boca Raton's Utility Services Department.

The expected benefit and outcome of the projects is sustainable and reliable drinking water transmission and distribution as well as wastewater collection infrastructure systems to provide critical and essential services to the City's customers. Outcome can be measured in improved levels of service as well a decreased system interruptions.
