## 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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We will provide workforce trainings to 1500 youth and issue 300 certificates in a comprehensive portfolio of workforce training programs in STEM related fields. We will also maintain and staff the groundbreaking sites for STEM workforce training in the Orlando, Miami, and Tampa Bay Metro Areas.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

We will host workforce trainings available for free to a minimum of 1500 youth and we will also provide any interested youth between the ages of 13-35 with free resume help and social media professionalism trainings. The certificates and education will provide all participants with an entry way into the STEM workforce employment by teaching them key skills to land an interview and the experience needed for entry into a series of STEM professions growing in Florida. Job training certificates will be offered in six (6) thematic areas of Urban Agriculture, Aquaculture, Hydroponics, Solar Workforce Training, Electric Vehicle Install Trainings, and Native Habitat Landscaping.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

There will be direct social, economic, and environmental benefits to the communities in which we operate. The youth we work with are also exposed to a series of STEM professionals in the community that will serve as mentors. Citizens will benefit from the sustainable development that comes from our presence in the areas this project serves.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

We will serve the target population of youth ages 13-35 in the Orlando, Tampa Bay, and Miami metro areas. A minimum of 1500 youth will be reached and we will also issue 300 certificates in our STEM workforce training portfolio.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The benefit of this project will be providing STEM workforce training for a minimum of 1500 youth from undeserved communities across Florida. Those certificates will be featured on resumes, scholarship applications, and highlighted in real-world interviews to employ our graduates. We will measure our outcomes using a host of economic, social, and environmental milestones for this project.
