### 14. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To protect a historic, lower-income neighborhood from storm surge and flooding. The project will transform a crumbling roadway and seawall into a grand waterfront boulevard, completing a critical segment of the City's Green ARTery trail which is a 22-mile permiter trail connecting parks and neighborhoods to downtown Tampa and jobs.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The City of Tampa needs to raise and strengthen the seawalls along Bermuda Boulevard from South of Ocean View Place to North of Linsey Street. The current seawalls are a century old and are rapidly deteriorating, posing a serious flood risk to the neighborhood.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

In addition to flood prevention and mitigation, the project will provide a waterfront amenity for residents and visitors. It will spur economic development efforts in the area. The project will also encourage healthier lifestyles by providing a facility for people to walk and bike.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Palmetto Beach is a historic neighborhood located East of Ybor City on Port Tampa Bay. The neighborhood is lowincome and extremely diverse. There are approximately 3,000 residents.

# e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will be measured by its ability to withstand hurricane storm sirge and projected rising sea levels based on accepted modelling practices.
