	Heart disease is the number one cause of death of Floridians. The purpose of the Heart Health Plus Program is to reduce health inequity in areas with a disproportionate burden of heart disease and related risk factors. Fifteen county health departments (CHD) have implemented Heart Health Plus activities, including blood pressure self-monitoring (BPSM) programs, within their communities. In addition, CHD staff work with community partners to provide screening and outreach within priority populations. They collaborate with health systems to establish policies and systems that encourage the use of BPSM. They also work to increase referrals to additional self-management and healthy behavior support services. \$500,000 will allow the Florida Department of Health to reach additional communities with the Heart Health Plus program. Currently there is no funding in the state budget for cardiovascular disease programs.

#### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The purpose of the Heart Health Plus Program is to reduce health inequity in areas with a disproportionate burden of heart disease and related risk factors. Fifteen county health departments (CHD) have implemented Heart Health Plus activities, including blood pressure self-monitoring (BPSM) programs, within their communities.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

County health department staff work with community partners to provide screening and outreach within priority populations. They collaborate with health systems to establish policies and systems that encourage the use of Blood Pressure Self Monitoring. They also work to increase referrals to additional self-management and healthy behavior support services.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Citizens will receive blood pressure screenings, education on blood pressure self monitoring (BPSM), healthy eating/nutrition information. Additionally, citizens will be referred to additional self-management and healthy behavior support services, such as Diabetes Prevention Programs (DPP), Diabetes Self-Management Education and Support (DSMES), and Quit Your Way services of Tobacco Free Florida.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target populations include Floridians living with and at high risk for cardiovascular disease and hypertension. Population includes elderly persons, persons with poor physical health, economically disadvantaged persons. Also persons living in rural communities will benefit from having the Heart Health Plus program in their community. We anticipate over 800,000 Floridians will be served once the program reaches more counties.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome is to prevent the prevalence of high blood pressure and cardiovascular disease in Florida. The expected benefits include bringing awareness to Floridians and educating individuals on self-managed care, the importance of taking medications properly and life-style changes that can be made to live a healthier life. This will lead to improved quality and access of care as well as a potentially leading to reduced health care costs for the state because individuals will have the tools and resources to better control their blood pressure keeping them out of emergency rooms and hospitals.
