14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The goal of this funding is the protection of three large, historic properties. The Alcazar Hotel and Pena-Peck House are individually listed in the National Register of Historic Places and the Visitor's Information Center is a contributing property to the St. Augustine National Register Historic District. These are working properties that contribute to the local economy but are too large for a small local government to maintain. In the past, the city has applied for DHR Special Category Grants, but grant funds are not reliable or sufficient to keep up with this level of maintenance.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The City of St. Augustine will use the funds to purchase the building materials (roofing, windows, flooring, etc.) and pay for a licensed general contractor with experience in maintaining historic buildings to complete the renovations in an appropriate manner.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Safeguarding these historic buildings will make them more resilient to storm events and allow them to be enjoyed and studied by future generations of citizens, school groups, historians and scholars.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The City of St. Augustine has a population of approximately 15,000 persons and hosts millions of visitors every year, these individuals and families are the target population.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of this funding is the protection of three large, historic buildings for many more years. The reduction in annual repairs and maintenance is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
