### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Protecting the downtown historic district and adjacent historic neighborhoods of St. Augustine from flooding during storm events. There is periodic flooding of downtown St. Augustine during exceptionally high tides, tropical storms and hurricanes and this project will provide a barrier to rising floodwaters and storm surges for some of the most important historic properties in the nation. State funding is critical to complete this project.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Critical infrastructure will be targeted for flood mitigation and resilience to serve the surrounding community, providing a higher level of service. This includes emergency ingress/egress, protection of 186 at risk residential/commercial/historic structures, upgraded utilities (water and sewer), upgraded stormwater, conversion of existing overhead power lines to underground.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Flood protection for private properties in the downtown historic district and adjacent residential neighborhoods to prevent damage to businesses, homes and the environment due to storms, sea level rise and climate change, including the protection of numerous properties listed in the National Register of Historic Places.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is all property owners and residents in downtown St. Augustine, including homeowners, business owners and institutional properties such as churches and schools. The number of property owners and residents who will see a direct benefit from this project is 3,300-3,500.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Reduced exposure from potential contamination from flooded waters. Reduced road impacts (such as frequency, duration and/or depth) of flooding from a variety of events: sunny day flooding, rainfall driven flooding, and impacts from coastal storms. Reduced financial impacts to current residential, commercial and governmental institutions as a result of flood damages. This can be documented with photographs and measured number of road flooding events.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
