To improve safety for pedestrians and vehicles on 2000-student campus and create more space for student activities and community events in the amphitheater.

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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction of a lighted pedestrian walkway between the two main areas of campus, a two-way road for vehicles and an extension of the roof of the existing amphitheater.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Improved safety and way-finding for students on the 2000-student campus, and visiting community members from the service area; increased space for students to gather and for community events.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Flagler-Palm Coast campus serves approximately 2000 students in the Nursing Program (full program), the associate of arts and several associate of science degrees.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improved safety for pedestrians and vehicles, easier access to campus facilities, and larger capacity at campus gatherings and community events. Improved campus appearance contributes to enrollment as well. Methodology may include number of safety concerns, numbers who attend events, and campus enrollment.
