## 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This program joins in state and local efforts to solve problems related to issues surrounding water quality and preservation of organisms in the Indian River Lagoon. It offers a sequence of courses that provides rigorous content to prepare students for career pathways in aquaculture and ecology restoration in Brevard County and surrounding communities.



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### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds provided will enhance the quality of life for citizens by providing research-based solutions to issues surrounding the Indian River Lagoon. Students will study the implications of pollution and the impact of human involvement in our ecosystem. They will regenerate bivalves for implantation into the IRL.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Students will propagate seed, produce, harvest, and process aquaculture species, and research the control of diseases, pests and water quality problems.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

At-risk youth, grade school students, and high school students. 150 in year one and each subsequent year. The program will serve high school students in 9-12 grades, as well as serve as an exploratory curriculum for elementary and middle

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Benefits and/or outcomes include: improve physical health, enrich cultural experiences, improve agricultural production/promotion/education, improve quality of education, enhance-preserve/improve environmental or fish and wildlife quality, protect the general public from harm, increase or improve economic activity and tourism, and provide internships to high school students in chosen career pathways. The methodology for measurement includes: online testing, assignments, oral presentations, and industry certification exams, better performance on academic testing as a result of mastery of learning outcomes, OJT participation and performance metrics, and local employment data.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The contracting agency may consider liquidated damages based on a monthly audit after a written warning outlining the items that fail to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract has been discussed. If after 1 month a financial deduction would occur in the amount of \$1,000 per month until remediation has been achieved.
