Analyze the County's and other publicly-available data sets in a multivariate approach spatially & temporally to look for patterns and trends in water quality pollution; visualize DEP Grant milestones; visualize said data analysis for managers/decision-makers/scientists/public; inform the County's development of a Reasonable Assurance Plan; support goals of the County's Biscayne Bay Task Force Report & inform development of the Biscayne Bay Watershed Management Advisory Board's Watershed Plan; inform managers and decision-makers of the economic importance of Biscayne Bay; Enhance public education through dashboard to showcase DEP grant milestones as well as status of Biscayne Bay health.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Support in multivariate data analysis to identify spatial and temporal trends using statistical tests and projecting results using data visualization tools including but not limited to GIS; interactive reports; visual explore patterns in data across multiple datasets at the same time.

- c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
- -Products and tools will help education the public on the health of Biscayne Bay, the status of publicly-funded grant milestones via dashboards and portals
- Statistical analysis, reporting, and data visualization will assist decision-makers, managers, and academia with prioritizing service such as improvements to stormwater and wastewater.

- All residents of Miami-Dade County as well as southern Broward and northern Monroe that share the watershed with Biscayne Bay
