	Each year in Palm Beach County just over 10,000 attend a Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten program, while over 13,000 attend Kindergarten, equaling a gap of 3000 children who do not attend a formal Division of Early Learning VPK program before they enter their first year of school. Of the 13000 Kindergarten children, approximately 600 Kindergarteners attend Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune Elementary, Lincoln Elementary, Washington Elementary, and West Riviera Elementary in the Riviera Beach Community. While we know that attending early learning before entering Kindergarten provides the essential foundation to a child's readiness, it has always proven difficult to find and reach families whose children do not interact with early learning
