The funds will allow 11 county sheriff's offices (Hernando, Baker, Santa Rosa, Martin, Manatee, Flagler, Charlotte, Nassau, Clay, Hardee, and Leon) to each purchase a Rapid DNA machine to install at their jail booking station. The use of a Rapid DNA machine will allow law enforcement to collect the DNA of a qualifying arrestee during the jail booking process and have the DNA sample cross-referenced with CODIS and results returned while an arrestee is still in custody (approximately 90 minutes).

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will allow 11 sheriff's offices to purchase a Rapid DNA machine to install at their jail booking station. The use of Rapid DNA machines will significantly reduce the amount of time it takes law enforcement to generate a DNA profile from an qualifying arrestee and cross-reference it with CODIS. This will allow law enforcement to determine whether the arrestee's DNA is a match to any unsolved crimes while the arrestee is still in custody.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The funds will assist law enforcement in determining whether a qualifying arrestee's DNA is a match to any unsolved crimes while that person is still in custody (within 90 minutes).

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funds will allow law enforcement to determine whether a qualifying arrestee's DNA is a match to any unsolved crimes before that person is released back into the community. This will enhance public safety and reduce costs to both law enforcement agencies and the citizens they serve.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All citizens.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Protect the general public from harm from criminals. The benefit can be measured based on the number of arrestees whose DNA is a match to an unsolved crime(s) and who are not released back into the community as a result.
