#### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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SFSC seeks to create a multiuse driving training facility to support law enforcement, commercial driving, electrical lineworkers, emergency vehicle operations (EMS and fire), and public school transportation. This will provide skills needed for high-wage positions for unemployed and underemployed in our community while supporting the transportation needs of Florida businesses. The tri-county region served by SFSC is deemed economically disadvantaged.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

SFSC will provide training and testing for Class A, B, and C commercial driver's licenses, passenger endorsement, and law enforcement defensive driving. This driving course will provide introductory driving skills and refresher emergency vehicle operations, as well as instruction on traffic safety measures on inner and outer perimeters.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Citizens will benefit with individuals for commercial vehicle driver's licensing, law enforcement, lineworker, and public school transportation. Students and employees will gain experience through a classroom setting, hands-on training, and practical experiences to include basic skills, backing maneuvers, high-speed pursuit driving and over-the-road experience.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population to be served includes unemployed and underemployed residents in the College's service district, students in the College's commercial vehicle driving, electrical lineworker programs and law enforcement training, as well as local businesses seeking qualified and certified drivers. The number of individuals directly served is estimated at 401-800 annually who, in turn, will be able to positively impact not only our local, but the Florida economy.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of the project is to provide a realistic and enhanced educational setting to meet the needs of our growing economy and distribution needs of our economically disadvantaged tri county area and throughout the state. The primary outcome of the project is the expansion and retention of the number of highly qualified and resilient certified drivers. Quantitative and qualitative methods will be utilized to measure the program's impact. The number of individuals served by the driving range training facility educational offerings will be documented in addition to employer and student state certifications.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Suggested penalty for failure to establish the driver training facility would be related to returning funds not utilized for the stated expenditures.
