4. Project/Program Description

The Florida-Israel Business Accelerator (FIBA), a project of the Tampa Jewish Community Centers and Federation, proposes to build on the momentum generated in 2022 to foster economic growth in Florida by connecting Florida's top industry sectors with high-tech Israeli companies whose products solve key business problems. In 2023, FIBA will identify statewide initiatives related to major infrastructure and transportation projects including water, ports, railway, airports, roads and bridges, and coastal structures. FIBA will work to identify Israeli high-tech companies that can offer unique solutions for these projects. FIBA will also continue to focus on connecting innovative technology solutions from Israel with Florida's tourism, hospitality and retail industries, as well as with partners in space, agriculture and health care - in order to address their most pressing operational challenges.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

FIBA will work with its Florida industry partners to identify their technology pain-points (shortfalls) and then curate Israeli technologies that map to those needs. FIBA will then facilitate the deployment of Israeli technology to various Florida industry sectors including infrastructure and transportation projects (water, ports, railway, airports, roads and bridges, and coastal structures). FIBA will also continue to connect innovative technology solutions from Israel with Florida's tourism, hospitality and retail industries, as well as with partners in space, agriculture and health care - in order to address their most pressing operational challenges.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

FIBA will coordinate with its key industry partners in Florida in order to determine their most pressing challenges as the State of Florida experiences exponential growth. This endeavor will focus on the Sarasota-Manatee area with statewide application for its solutions. The project will include identifying and connecting proven Israeli technology companies to Florida-based industry partners in need of innovative solutions to create production and development efficiencies related to major infrastructure and transportation projects; building partnerships between Israeli and Florida companies or investors that encourage Israeli companies to open US subsidiaries in Florida thus creating high-skilled/high-wage jobs; and continue collaborating with Florida economic development and entrepreneur organizations to provide resources to Israeli companies looking to grow their businesses in Florida.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Florida's ever-increasing demographic and economic growth requires an immediate and streamlined approach to expansion of its infrastructure through increased efficiencies and productivity for the State's various development initiatives and for its partners who will build these infrastructure projects. Israeli technological advances that map to - and are applied to - these infrastructure challenges will benefit individual Floridians by helping to provide the necessary statewide growth to accommodate the exponential influx of new residents to the state of Florida.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Statewide, the population will be positively impacted by the deployment of proven Israeli technology that creates production and development efficiencies related to major infrastructure and transportation projects. In addition, the statewide population - and people employed in - some of Florida's key industries including hospitality/retail, agriculture, cybersecurity and healthcare will benefit from efficiencies gained through the use of Israeli innovation in these fields. FIBA will address cross-industry challenges including labor shortages, employee burnout, employee and customer safety, customer loyalty and remote access to personal and professional services - all of which will impact Florida residents statewide.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Methodology includes partnering with key Florida industry sectors to overcome their immediate technology needs as they seek to increase production and development efficiencies related to major infrastructure and transportation projects.
