4. Project/Program Description

Expansion of the Northwest Florida State College Campus in South Walton Co and construction of Seacoast Collegiate High School on that Campus, serving as an expanded and permanent facility for Seacoast, as well as a new shared workforce / business incubation center. Seacoast currently holds a long-term (40 year + renewals) land lease from the College. Post Secondary Education is almost non-existent in Walton Co, requiring the County's dual enrolled students and residents to travel approximately one hour each way to neighboring Okaloosa Co. These proposed new facilities will expand capacity for the College and Seacoast and offer new educational opportunities located upon the underutilized College property in Walton Co, better serving the surrounding communities with expanded programming and alternatives to the current requirement to travel to the College's main campus. The curriculum will be a collaborative effort, workforce driven, with CTE coursework as well as traditional pathways.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Construction of Seacoast Collegiate High School on the NWFSC Campus in S Walton Co, serving as an expanded and permanent facility for Seacoast, and new shared workforce/business incubation center. Postsecondary education is almost non-existent in Walton County, requiring the County's dual enrolled students and resident to travel to neighboring Okaloosa County. These proposed new facilities will expand capacity for the College and Seacoast and offer local educational opportunities.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction of Seacoast Collegiate High School for dual enrolled students grades 9-12, a well as construction of a new shared facility which will house a workforce/business incubation center. New facilities will improve access to entrepreneurial opportunities, local business employment and internship opportunities and offer expanded curriculum and career-technical certificates.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Once completed, the project will serve secondary 9-12, post-secondary, workforce training, industrial skills and trades, traditional A.A. and career A.S. pathways through dual enrollment, with CTE coursework and a business incubator known as the "Accelerator" serving industrial skills trades, offering workforce development and community educational events and opportunities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The primary target is Seacoast Collegiate High School dual enrolled students. It is expected that programming would allow for up to 800 students (traditional and non-traditional) to be served by the campus in its first phase. A planned second phase would allow for more, as would virtual programming. Other populations served will be grade school students, at-risk youth, economically disadvantaged persons, jobless persons, and citizens seeking workforce training.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected benefits are providing a local resource for dual enrollment, college, workforce training initiatives; improving access to dual enrollment; improving access to entrepreneurial opportunities; local business employment and internship opportunities; career-technical certifications and certificates. Students will no longer have to travel to neighboring counties to attend dual enrollment and other postsecondary classes. Methodology for measuring outcome will be data to be captured each school year through enrollment numbers, school district reporting, and college enrollment numbers through Northwest Florida State College. Data can be measured to compare the number of certifications and certificates offered vs. completed.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Funding will be returned to the State of Florida if the project does not initiate.
