b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This program offers a sequence of courses that provide coherent and rigorous content aligned with challenging academic standards and relevant technical knowledge and skills needed to prepare for further education and careers in the Agriculture career cluster.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The content includes but is not limited to instruction in animal and plant production and processing; agriculture marketing; agriculture mechanics; employability skills; mathematics; basic science; biological sciences; communication; and human-relation skills.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target population includes students in the Walton County School District. 401 - 800 students are projected to be served by this CTE over the next decade.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

50% increase in Agriculture industry certifications 3% increase in graduation rate of CTE students vs non-CTE students 5% increase in post-secondary attendance of CTE students vs non-CTE students
