c. Organization Type

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Students in grades K-3 will be exposed to careers within different industries through exploration activities on a mobile CTE lab, opening their eyes to potential interests they may have for future studies. Students in grades 4-5 will have the opportunity to take digital tool exams, gaining early exposure to certification.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Elementary students in Duval will participate in career exposure activities through the use of a mobile CTE lab. The lab will travel across the school district, providing an on-campus "field trip" for students to enhance their understanding of career opportunities in our community. In addition, 4th and 5th grade students will participate in curriculum to prepare for digital tool certification.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This project will increase career exposure opportunities for students at the elementary level and therefore ensure CTE is a K-12 experience in Duval County Public Schools. Students in grades K-3 will be exposed to careers within different industries through exploration activities on a mobile CTE lab, opening their eyes to potential interests they may have for future studies. Students in grades 4-5 will have the opportunity to take digital tool exams, gaining early exposure to certification.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project will service elementary aged students in the district providing hands-on experience in high-need industries in our local area. We project over 800 students will be served. In addition, creating curriculum for students to authentically engage with digital skills and earn certifications will directly prepare students for middle and high school.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Exposure to a wide range of careers; doing so at a young age is great as there is little pressure for your child to commit to a career. This exposure will help children feel accomplished by providing them as many opportunities as you can that will allow them to develop and enhance their skills and abilities.
