### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Collins Avenue is the only north-south transportation corridor in Sunny Isles Beach and is a six-lane divided arterial roadway. The sidewalks on either side of Collins Avenue are 6-7' wide at back of curb and do not adequately support the City's pedestrians. The community needs a safe north-south connection to support multi-modal transportation.

**b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?**

The proposed urban trail project is approximately 1,000' in length and is located to the west of Collins Avenue, along the outer edge of the Golden Shores residential neighborhood and multi-family buildings.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

The Urban Trail will offer a safe and pleasant connection for pedestrians, cyclists and micro mobility users (scooters) that connects Heritage Park and Golden Shores Park and several multi-family buildings at the north end to commercial activity, the Community School, Government Center, Library and several parks at the southern end.

**d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?**

The general public. Total population who may be served by this project is over 22,000 residents.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

The Urban Trail will provide a safe north-south connection to support multi-modal transportation measurable through an increase in pedestrian participation of walking, cycling, and micro mobility users (scooters). The Urban Trail will increase pedestrian safety as it will provide a safer alternative to the current sidewalks on Collins Avenue which do not adequately support the City's pedestrians measurable through an anticipated reduction in vehicle versus pedestrian accidents. Additionally, the Urban Trail will play a vital role in improving the community's physical health as it will create an opportunity for pedestrians to increase their physical activity through walking and/or cycling measurable through the number of pedestrians using the Urban Trail as an alternate mode of transportation.
