a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Funds provided by this appropriation would allow the City of Fort Walton Beach (City) to expand its emergency services capabilities and would place a fire station in an area essential to providing services to the City's west side and Commerce and Technology Park (CTP). The CTP contains private companies that are essential to Eglin AFB and Hurlburt Field and to the U.S. military's aerospace operations. Companies such as Lockheed-Martin, Boeing, BAE, & Micro Systems are located in the CTP.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Increased fire prevention, life safety, and emergency management response and education to residents and businesses. Our community risk reduction program the CARES (Community Assistance, Referral, and Education Service) will be a direct benefit to everyone. Drug and violence prevention programs, community CPR classes and a cadet program that recruits, trains, educates, and employees at risk citizens.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Increased fire prevention, life safety, and emergency management response and education to residents and businesses. Our community risk reduction program the CARES (Community Assistance, Referral, and Education Service) will be a direct benefit to everyone. Drug and violence prevention programs, community CPR classes and a cadet program that recruits, trains, educates, and employees at risk citizens. The station design can house eight personnel at one time. The station will be open to law enforcement to establish a substation to have a much-needed presence on the West side. This will lead to improved fire response time and improved police response.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The emergency services provided by units assigned to this fire station would benefit all 21,000 residents of the City of Fort Walton Beach and others in surrounding areas of unincorporated Okaloosa County.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improved physical health through improved Emergency Response Times; Improved quality of education through increased Fire Prevention, Life Safety & Emergency Management outreach programs to the public; Protect the general public from harm through Improved Emergency Response Times; and Increase or improve economic activity through maintained or improved Insurance Services Office (ISO) rating for insurance purposes.
