Meals on Wheels provides social services to our most vulnerable and needy in the community. We currently deliver over 200 meals per day, without any governmental support. We have received, transported, processed and donated over 1,250,000 lbs of food to feed our local and surrounding community in the last year. Additionally, we host educational classes and instructional seminars in partnership with Advent Health, Premier Health and Palm Medical to promote healthy living in our community. We host an afterschool program with Pasco County Parks and Recreation.

We host events for local businesses and organizations and offer resources for our local police department and the East side of the County. As we see the economic turmoil in our country and local communities, these programs continue to grow in importance. In 2022, we saw a 30% increase in demand for services, and it is our mission to meet those needs and be the conduit between the community and it's needs.
