4. Project/Program Description

Established in 1827, the lake is centrally situated in the City of Milton and is a natural collection point for stormwater and sediment discharge. Siltation continues to diminish water quality and contributes to the proliferation of exotic aquatic plants both in the lake and downstream. Dredging the lake to restore it to its original condition and installing sediment basins and stormwater pretreatment will serve to protect our natural resources, ecosystems, fisheries, marine and wildlife habitats, and coastal wetlands. After dredging the lake, the project will install sediment and trash collection devices on the existing stormwater discharge points into the lake to reduce the quantity of non-point source pollutants going into the lake to management levels.
