The purpose/goal of this project is to complete the paving and drainage improvements necessary on Greenhead Road from SR 77 to Long Lake Estates' entrance for a total project length of 2.6 miles. Paving and drainage improvements would greatly improve the roadway condition of this major feeder road that traverses between SR 77 and Porter Pond Road in Washington County and provides access to the Econfina Creek Water Management Area. Construction shall consist of a new asphalt roadway on the currently graded Greenhead Road with two 11' travel lanes, grassed shoulders, and drainage improvements including roadside swales, cross drain replacement, and side drain construction.
